 - You don't provide office space
 - You don't provide equipment or furniture
 - You don't provide benefits or insurance
 - You don't pay for training
 - You don't pay for vacations, sick time and family emergencies
 - You don't pay federal and local government employee fees
 - You only pay for work done!
 - A VA is less expensive. The business owner who hires a full time in-house assistant will pay 2080 hours even in industry down time in order to keep that employee.
